missed almost half of my kinder-■ garten year due to illness. School was a 'vague' place I went to sometimes. On my first day at St. Paul School, I was greeted by Sr. Marie Annetta, my 1st grade teacher. She wore a strange 'costume' with wings and despite the darkness of her garb, there was a sweetness emanating from her. Sister reached down, cupped my hands in hers, and said "welcome." She seemed to know of my

past year's plight and made me feel it was going to be all right. My insecurities vanished as she positively impacted my life. I wanted to be a teacher, just like her, and without knowing the true meaning of the word, I wanted to be kind, just like her.

I fondly recall Sr. Mary Conrad, my 3rd grade teacher, playing whiffle ball with us at recess. I recently found a holy card written to me from Mrs. Marye Fisher, my 6th grade teacher, that contained the most encouraging sentiments. Then there was the choir led by Sr. Marie Annetta that validated for me that with a voice like hers, she had to be an angel.

Being a student at St. Paul made me love school. For years, on the first day of summer vacation I would set up a classroom on my back porch,

complete with chalkboard and student desks. I would line up my dolls and don a make-shift habit and address 'the class' as Sr. Sandi. Of course, one of my 'students' was a nun doll. For a few years I announced I wanted to also be a teaching nun. Ultimately I chose the former.

I would not have become a teacher without the experiences that I had at St. Paul School. The ground work was set there for what would become my career. I felt love and concern for me not only intellectually, but morally and spiritually. I learned the true meaning of giving oneself to benefit others. What extraordinary role models I had that propelled me to become a teacher. I paid attention to God's calling over my life and give Him all the glory for placing me at St. Paul School.

Sandra Ciotti Hunt taught Spanish, French, German, Italian, and English for Students of Other Languages for 45 years in public and private high schools in Ohio, Illinois, North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia. She also served as a translator for IBM Corporation and a foreign language interpreter for police departments and hospitals. Sandra achieved many honors including Georgia Foreign Language Teacher of the Year (2003); Georgia Teacher of the year finalist in all subjects (1997); Who's Who Among America's Teachers (2002, 1994, 1991); The Atlanta Journal-Constitution Honor Teacher Award (2001); Jennings Scholar (1973); and several county teacher of the year awards. Sandra holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Education and Spanish from Kent State University. She lives in Valdosta, Georgia.

We hope these reflections will inspire our alumni to reflect on their own time at St. Paul and the positive impact that their St. Paul School education has had on their lives.

Paul Balok, Class of 1939

I'm 99 and still have vivid memories of St. Paul School. I was baptized, confirmed, served as an altar boy, played on the basketball and baseball teams, participated in theater, spelling bees, and sang our school song.* My teachers (I remember Sisters Agnes, Leonardo, Helena, and Virginia) and priests (I remember Fathers Casey, Jones, and Cook) created the foundation upon which I built my faith which has sustained me for all these years.

*School Song (as i recall it): "Oh me oh my, we will get there bye and bye. If anyone loves St. Paul School it's me, me, me. Oh me oh my, we will get there bye and bye. If any one loves St. Paul School it's I, I, I."

Eric Murray, Class of 1985

I try to view my personal and professional life through the lens of my faith. I credit my parents and St. Paul School for building a foundation of faith in me that I reflect on guite often, if not daily. St. Paul also gave me the academic foundation to achieve professionally. I now find myself working for a retirement community and it is a privilege to try to do God's work as we care for our seniors. I now view this more as a vocation which makes all aspects of my life, from husband and father to worker, aligned with true purpose.

During my eight years as a student at St. Paul School, we were constantly reminded that "God loves you." That significant truth has stayed with me during my entire life regardless of the circumstances and events, both good and bad. I have found that knowing this strengthens my faith in God's love and mercy for me and each day I am reminded that "God loves me."

Louis Markovich, Class of 1963

I attended St. Paul School grade 1 through 8 graduating 60 years ago. Six classmates were top ten students of the Salem High School graduating class, and four classmates graduated together from the University of Notre Dame. Without a doubt, St. Paul School provided a strong academic foundation. But most important was the religious environment that it provided: attending Mass every day before school began, being an altar server, saying the Rosary at the end of the school day, attending Stations of the Cross during Lent, and much, much more. These have lasted a lifetime for me.

Joyce Lowry Laughlin

Joyce Lowry Laughlin, a member of the St. Paul School Class of 1943, and her late husband, James Laughlin, bequeathed \$33,000 to the St. Paul School Foundation following her passing on January 19, 2023, at age 93. Joyce was a devout, lifelong Catholic who believed strongly in the value of Catholic education. Her husband, a Presbyterian, attended the Saturday vigil Mass faithfully with Joyce at St. Paul Church, and she devotedly attended Sunday services at the Salem Presbyterian Church with him, supporting each other's practice of their faith. The foundation is profoundly grateful for the Laughlins' generosity in support of Catholic education.



Mark Hurray

On June 26th, the City of Bridgman, Michigan, dedicated its recently completed Bridgman Courtyard in loving memory of Mark Hurray (SPS 1970) to recognize his service and contributions to the community. In his dedication remarks, City Manager Jan Ganum paid tribute to Mark, who served as chairman of the Bridgman Planning Commission and made a substantial financial contribution for the courtyard, as "genuine, honest, humble, unassuming, community-minded, and a fundamentally decent human being whom everyone liked." A plaque dedicated to Mark in the courtyard attests to his civic-mindedness and noble spirit. Mark passed away following a brief illness on April 12, 2022.

A LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Members of the St. Paul Community,

hat an exciting year we have ahead of us at St.
Paul School! This year there are
113 students enrolled—thriving and learning with us each day! St. Paul School offers preschool through grade 7 where all students are engaged in a robust curriculum aligned with diocesan and state academic standards.

We have many successes to share in this year's newsletter! Thirty-two students participated in our local science fair in February 2023, with four of our local winners advancing to attend the district fair at Youngstown State where they took top honors and advanced to the State Science Day! Aaron Rea and Jack Brown received superior ratings and attended the State Showcase of Science at the Ohio State University—with Aaron Rea receiving two prestigious awards!

St. Paul School also hosted many community events and participated in other activities throughout this past year—including the Ohio Stem Learning Network (OSLN) STEM Design Challenge where our fifth graders won the creativity award with their design of a 'Future-Proof Poultry Protector." In March the school hosted a "Plasma Ball" community science night open to

the public featuring over 20 STEM hands-on learning experiences! In April we featured our "Bunny Hop: Egg Science" community event. We are grateful for the many opportunities for STEM learning, sharing, and collaboration in our locality as well as throughout Ohio!

We are very pleased to share that St Paul School was awarded a distinguished 2023 Ohio Governor's Edison Award for STEM Excellence! In addition to that, three of our teachers were recognized with individual awards for their work coaching students in the OSLN Design contest, providing guidance for

our science fair research, and coaching technical writing efforts. The teachers receiving the honors are: Mrs. Darby Hall, Art/STREAM; Mrs. Heather Livesay, Science/5th Grade; and, Ms. Teresa Sisson, Social Studies/Religion. Our school also began participation in the Catholic Math League, where we placed 39th in the nation last year!

This year we made some improvements to the school building and property. The old auxiliary trailer was removed from behind the school. Through the generosity of donors, we were able to replace some classroom chairs

and tables for our intermediate students. The connection to the power grid was updated with Ohio Edison. Phase 1 of the fundraising for our playground on Giving Tuesday was successful and we are grateful! We are in a holding pattern on purchasing new playground equipment until the parish plans for paving of parking lot are ready--but we are so humbled and grateful for everyone's support for a children's play area!

Ohio recently expanded the EdChoice Scholarship eligibility, making tuition assistance available to all families. St. Paul School applied for and received an extensive Ohio High Dosage Tutoring grant, which funds expert tutors who will work with many of our students four times per

week for half an hour! We are still awaiting word on a few other grant applications which will help us update the building and acquire more resources for our students!

Our arts programs were expanded this year, with additional offerings in art/design and music. We have 50 students in band this year and 16 in choir. The students love participating at our weekly allschool Mass, especially singing with our choir! The students' favorite hymns are "Soul on Fire," "10,000 Reasons," and "Your Grace is Enough." Our students participated in two art contests this year, with St. Paul School students winning two awards! Two students also had their literary works published.

Unfortunately, our former pastor (Monsignor Polando) resigned in September 2023. Father Lavelle has been serving as our Parish Administrator. We have been very blessed to have Father Brian Smith celebrating Mass with us and working with our students. He visits the children frequently, greets families at dismissal, and has even helped serve lunch with us for our students! Our new pastor, Father Joseph Ruggieri, will arrive here on November 15, 2023.

St. Paul School students continue to make virtual trips around the world through our "World Wide Wednesday" program. We begin Wednesday mornings with announcements about places around the world-including

information on travel, geography, religion, culture, and language. Students extend their learning in their classrooms. Our cafeteria director, Mrs. Baranovich, continues to provide unique ethnic meals and experiences at lunch on Wednesdays! We have been fortunate to have lunches sometimes sponsored by donors so that students receive special treats or experiences...like chopsticks, authentic coins, music, authentic treats/desserts, or other cultural artifacts relevant to our destinations!

Our school is fully staffed this year, with an exceptional team of teachers and support staff! We are truly blessed by the strong support from our families, parish, alumni, and community. Every note, call, visit, or donation from our community inspires us and helps us grow our mission to serve families with the high quality, rigorous Catholic education that has been part of St. Paul School since it was founded in 1904! We are excited about our future!

rederick A. "Fritz" Schlueter, a 2008 graduate of St. Paul School, was ordained as a priest of the Diocese of Youngstown by Bishop David Bonnar in St. Columba Cathedral on June 17, 2023. Following his ordination, Rev. Schlueter expressed his thoughts on becoming a priest by saying 'I feel so humbled that God has called me to this ministry and chosen me for it... Now it's about a lifetime of responding to the call and trying to live it out well.'

According to The Catholic Echo (August 2023), a publication of the Diocese of Youngstown, Fritz first felt the call to a priestly vocation while attending a teen program at Catholic Familyland in Bloomingdale, Ohio, and then during his freshman year at the

University of Dallas. There he prayed daily for the Lord's grace to guide him. On one weekend, with encouragement from several friends and inspiration from the Responsorial Psalm at Sunday Mass ("If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts"), Fritz made the decision to attend the seminary. He entered after completing his freshman year of college.

Rev. Schlueter offered an exultant Mass of Thanksgiving the day following his ordination at St. Paul Church in Salem, his home parish where he has been a member since his baptism. Those in attendance marveled at the joy and beauty of the celebration. Dinner followed in the school for Fritz's family, parishioners, guests, and many priests from the diocese. Fritz's first assignment is as parochial vicar (assistant pastor) at St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Canton, Ohio, and Holy Family Parish in Navarre.

Foundation Welcomes New Pastor

The St. Paul School Foundation is pleased to welcome Rev. Joseph Ruggieri, a priest of the Diocese of Youngstown, as the new pastor of St. Paul (Salem) and St. Patrick (Leetonia) parishes.

Father Ruggieri was born on March 18, 1967, in Austintown, Ohio. He was ordained in 1995 after receiving a Master of Divinity degree at Mount St. Mary Seminary. He served as parochial vicar at St. Patrick in Kent, Ohio, from 1995 to 2000, then as parochial vicar at St. Joan of Arc in Canton from 2000 to 2003. He has also served at Our Lady of Mount Carmel and Mother of Sorrows parishes in Ashtabula, Christ the Good Shepard Parish in Campbell, Regina Coeli Parish in Alliance, St. Joseph in Washington Township and St. Rose in Girard. Most recently, Father Ruggieri has been the parochial vicar at four parishes in Portage County: St. Joan of Arc in Streetsboro, St. Joseph in Mantua, St. Ambrose in Garrettsville, and Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Aurora. In

addition, he has served on the Priests' Personnel Board, the Diocesan Cemetery Board, the Presbyterial Council, and as a chaplain for the Kent State University Police Department.

The foundation also extends it sincere gratitude and appreciation to Very Rev. John-Michael Lavelle, D. Min. and Rev. Brian Smith who served St. Paul and St. Patrick parishes for several months while both parishes awaited the appointment of a new pastor.

SCHOOL News

STEM

STREAM (Science, Technology, Religion, Education, Arts, and Mathematics) content is threaded throughout our curriculum at St. Paul School.


In every classroom and every subject our teachers work to integrate real-world applications. Students work on PBL (Problem-based learning), discovery-learning, and inquiry-based activities. We focus both on individual and collaborative group skills.

This year students also have STREAM classes in the school's MakerSpace featuring many tools such as 3D printers and pens, Legos, Robotics, and more!

As an Ohio STEM-designated school, we continue our agriculture theme and focus on the

Laudato Si, (the second encyclical of Pope Francis) action platform. However, we have a special theme this year of "Space." In October we hosted a NASA astronaut, and the Carnegie Science Center brought its mobile planetarium here. Our students have focused on how to sustain life on other planets and have been working with Starlab under the OSLN #STEMOrbitsOhio initiative. The future is bright for this next generation of travelers!

Students use the "design process" to tackle problems. This involves: (1) Asking the question (what is the problem?); (2) Imagining solutions (brainstorm); (3) Developing a plan (plan & collect needed materials); (4) Creating a prototype (and testing it); (5) Improving the prototype; (6) Presenting a solution!

Science Fair Success!

Thirty-two students participated in our local science fair in February. The research and presentations were excellent! Five students (Lexi Anderson, Sophia Bender, Jack Brown, Giancarlo Corallo, and Aaron Rea) took top honors at the local science fair. Four of them then participated in the District Science Days (District 15) at Youngstown State University. Sophia Bender, Jack Brown, Giancarlo Corallo, and Aaron Rea all received awards and superior ratings there! They advanced to the Ohio Academy of Science State Science Day. Sophia Bender and Giancarlo Corallo received excellent ratings, and Jack Brown and Aaron Rea received superior ratings for their research! Jack Brown and Aaron Rea were then invited to the prestigious Ohio State Science Showcase, where Aaron Rea received mulitiple awards! He was awarded both the Dr. Lynn E. Elfner Young Scientist Award and the Thermo Fisher Scientific Junior Innovators Nomination.

to reseach problems, discuss ideas, and construct prototypes. The activities will culiminate in presentations at the school this spring. Top teams from our school will advance to the state #STEMOrbitsOhio competition!

Mrs. Mincks (Ecology) has been working with students simulating soil from Mars. Students then work to condition it so that it may sustain agriculture in outer space! Her students have been conducting soil tests and seed germination experiments in the different soil. Additionally students have planted hydroponic gardens and fungi. A group of students is also working to dehydrate fruits and vegetables to explore different ways to transport and store food in space.

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
