Fortunately, St. Paul still offers an outstanding education in a Catholic-Christian environment that in many ways is unparalleled. Indeed, true value still exists at this shining star of a school. Several thousand students (all of <u>us</u>) have already benefited from not only the superior education received at St. Paul, but the lifelong values that were instilled there.

From the Desk of Father Eisweirth

<u>Saint Paul School</u> has contributed to the formation of many young people in our community for over one hundred years. The school has been and continues to be part of our parish mission and as a parish we can be very proud of our school. In 2007, there are two concerns facing Saint Paul School. We need to <u>increase the enrollment</u> and we need to <u>create a situation where the school is more financially self-sufficient.</u>

You can help Saint Paul School remain healthy by making a financial contribution to Saint Paul Parish, the School, or the School Foundation. Last year the parish contributed \$400,985 to the school's operating budget. We also had to replace the roof on the school and make repairs to the drainage system outside the school. The repairs cost the parish \$94,000. Saint Paul School Foundation contributed \$50,000 towards those repairs.

If you donate or leave money to Saint Paul Parish, we will invest that money wisely. The parish investments have allowed us to continue to foster the mission of our parish to bring Christ's presence into the community. You can donate directly to the school and that money will be used for tuition assistance or school operations. We already have parishioners and friends of the school who are Tuition Angels and they pay for a child to attend the school! If you donate to Saint Paul School Foundation it will assist them in ensuring a secure future for the school. Each year the Foundation contributes money for tuition assistance and other necessary

improvements to the school. The money that is given for tuition assistance is divided among families who are experiencing financial difficulty. No student is turned away because his or her family cannot afford the tuition.

So please consider making a financial contribution to Saint Paul Parish, to the School or to the School Foundation. If you contribute now it could be a tax deduction! I am honored to be the current principal of Saint Paul School. Saint Paul School has a proud tradition of educating students from the families of Saint Paul Parish and the surrounding parishes and communities for over one hundred years. We are a school that educates the mind, body and spirit of each child in the Catholic tradition.

Catholic education has been a major part of my life since I was a child. I spent the first 13 years of education in Catholic Schools. I attended Incarnation School in Trenton, New Jersey, Saint Mary's School and John F. Kennedy High School in Warren, Ohio.

I received my Bachelor's of Science degree from Kent State University in 1973. I began my teaching career by establishing the Kindergarten program at Saint Paul School in the fall of the same year. St. Paul School - A Superior Educational Experience

Since its founding in 1904, St. Paul School has delivered a generally superior education to its students. Today, St. Paul continues its tradition of high-quality education as it fulfills its mission to educate the mind, body, and spirit of each student.

Recent statistical data supports the notion that St. Paul students are excelling academically. Various achievement test scores indicate the academic success of our students. Additionally, a large percentage of our students achieve honor roll status as they progress to middle school and high school. For example, a recent honor roll showed 65% of our students in grades 7-12 were on the honor roll of their respective schools.

Furthermore, despite the fact that St. Paul students make up less than 10% of

the graduation seniors, a very significant percentage of the top ten graduates within the past five years were former St. Paul Students. And, most of the top 15% of the high School graduates are St. Paul graduates, eventually going on to be leaders in the community.

St. Paul School is blessed with competent and dedicated faculty and staff. The small class sizes are conducive to learning, as is the overall teaching environment which encourages excellence and discipline. Parental involvement is also an important factor in the school's success.

Computer Lab

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Foundation Provides State of the Art Computer Lab for Students

In response to the need for updated technology at St. Paul School, the St. Paul School Foundation recently purchased 18 new Pentium 4 Dual Core computers and flat LCD monitors for the existing computer lab. The computers were in need of upgrade in accordance with the Diocese of Youngstown's Technology Rotation Policy. "We are grateful that the St. Paul School Foundation was able to fund this \$20,000 purchase so our kids could have the best technology available to date," said Patricia Bauman, St. Paul School Principal.

Funding technology is nothing new for the St. Paul School Foundation: this is the 4th time they have facilitated a major computer purchase and/or expansion at the school. They have invested close to \$100,000 dollars in school technology purchases, which is a major task for a small foundation.
