Special Assistance Provision 2—2025**

The *St. Paul School* today announced a change to its policy for serving meals for children served under the {**National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program**} for the {2024/2025} school year. This new change will allow all children at all schools/sites to be served meals at no charge.

The ability of the *St. Paul School* to offer this special alternative, called Provision 2, rests upon the success of the school in receiving a completed application for free and reduced-price meals for the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program from each household in the school.
